AFFIDAVIT

John H. Coleman, being duly sworn, states:

- 1. I am a Special Agent with the U.S. Immigration and Customs
 Enforcement within the Department of Homeland Security. I have been employed as a
 Special Agent for approximately eleven years. I am presently assigned to the Office of
 Professional Responsibility located in Portsmouth, New Hampshire. Prior to my current
 position, I was employed as a Senior Special Agent with the Immigration and Customs
 Enforcement in Boston, MA. Prior to that I was employed as a Senior Special Agent with
 the United States Customs Service in Chicago, IL. I began my career in Federal Law
 Enforcement in 1991 as an Inspector with the United States Customs Service in Boston,
 MA. I was employed as an Inspector for approximately seven years. As part of my current
 position as a Senior Special Agent with the Office of Professional Responsibility, I have
 received specialized training in conducting internal investigations of employees within the
 United States government.
- 2. This affidavit is submitted in support of a criminal complaint charging **LORRAINE HENDERSON** ("HENDERSON") with encouraging and inducing an illegal alien to remain in the United States in knowing or reckless disregard for the fact that such residence is in violation of law, for the purpose of private financial gain, in violation of 8 U.S.C. §§1324(a)(1)(A)(iv) and 1324(a)(1)(B).
- 3. This affidavit summarizes an investigation into HENDERSON's criminal activities which was initiated in March 2008. Since this affidavit is being submitted for the limited purpose of establishing probable cause to believe that HENDERSON committed a violation of 8 U.S.C. §§1324(a)(1)(A)(iv) and 1324(a)(1)(B), I have not included each and every fact known to me concerning this investigation. The foregoing facts are based on my personal participation in this investigation, my review of recordings made of HENDERSON by an illegal alien who had been hired and encouraged to remain in the United States by HENDERSON, as well as information and reports provided to me by other agents and employees of the Department of Homeland Security.

BACKGROUND OF DEFENDANT

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4. **LORRAINE HENDERSON** (YOB 1957) has a residence on Brittania Circle in Salem, Massachusetts. HENDERSON serves as the Department of Homeland Security, Customs and Border Protection, Boston Area Port Director. HENDERSON has held this position since December 2003. Prior to being appointed as the Boston Area Port director, HENDERSON was employed as a Program Manager with U.S. Customs and Border Protection in Washington, D.C. for approximately 10 years.

5. Boston Area Port Director: As the Boston Area Port Director, HENDERSON is responsible for the supervision of all activities relating to the international arrival and departure of persons and cargo in Massachusetts, Rhode Island, and Connecticut. Among the ports of entry which HENDERSON oversees are Logan International Airport, Black Falcon Cruise Terminal, Conely Terminal, T.F. Green International Airport, and Bradley International Airport, among others. HENDERSON supervises approximately 220 employees, including approximately 190 armed and uniformed Customs and Border Protection Officers. As the Boston Area Port Director, HENDERSON herself carries a firearm and a Department of Homeland Security badge. Among the many duties of the Boston Area Port Director, HENDERSON is responsible for the inspection and admission of foreign nationals who seek entry into the United States through the Boston Area ports of entry. HENDERSON is charged with preventing the entry of illegal aliens into the United States through the Boston Area ports of entry, and is authorized to grant or deny waivers to illegal aliens seeking entry into the United States, based on applicable federal immigration law. HENDERSON is also responsible for identifying potential terrorists and instruments of terror, and for performing enforcement activities to prevent the entry of terrorists and instruments of terror into the United States. HENDERSON also oversees enforcement activities designed to prevent the importation of illegal narcotics and other contraband into the United States through the Boston Area ports of entry. As noted above, Boston Area ports of entry include all air and sea international ports in Massachusetts, Connecticut and Rhode Island.

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6. Joint Intake Center Complaint: On March 19, 2008, the Department of Homeland Security Joint Intake Center (JIC) in Washington, D.C., received information from the U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) Field Operations Division in Boston, Massachusetts concerning HENDERSON. CBP in Boston reported that there was credible evidence to believe that HENDERSON was employing an illegal alien from Brazil and that HENDERSON was doing so after having being warned by a CBP officer, referred to herein as "Officer A," that the employee was present in the United States illegally.

7. Henderson Introduces Illegal Alien to CBP Officer: On April 18, 2008, I conducted an interview of Officer A in Boston. Officer A stated that on or about the summer of 2004, she was looking for someone to clean her residence. HENDERSON, who lived near Officer A, recommended a Brazilian national referred to herein as "Illegal Alien 1" or "IA1." HENDERSON stated to Officer A that she employed IA1 to clean her home and that HENDERSON had found her from a flyer that had been posted in her condominium complex in Salem, MA. HENDERSON said IA1 was very attractive, trustworthy and thorough, although her spoken English was poor. HENDERSON also said that IA1 cleaned her home during the day while HENDERSON was at work. On HENDERSON's recommendation, Officer A hired IA1 and employed her to clean Officer A's home approximately once a month for just over one year. Officer A paid IA1 by check.

8. **CBP Warnings About Hiring Illegal Aliens**: In November 2005, Officer A received a memorandum from CBP Headquarters which warned CBP employees not to employ illegal aliens as domestic help. In addition, in early December 2005, Officer A received a "Muster" from CBP Headquarters, which again cautioned CBP employees not to employ illegal aliens in their homes or any other off-duty capacity. The Muster, which came in the form of an email, was issued to Officer A, HENDERSON and other CBP employees nationwide. Shortly thereafter, Officer A met with IA1 in Officer A's home and asked whether IA1 was a legal resident of the United States. IA1 admitted that she was unlawfully residing in this country and that she had paid thousands of dollars to enter the

United States over the Mexican border. Officer A explained to the IA1 that she worked for the government and could not continue to employ IA1. Officer A also explained to IA1 that HENDERSON was employed by the government and would also not be able to employ her anymore. Officer A terminated IA1's employment that day and reported the incident to her supervisor in Boston. In addition to explaining that she had inadvertently employed an illegal alien to clean her home, Officer A told the supervisor that she intended to tell HENDERSON about IA1's status as an illegal alien.

- 9. **CBP Officer Confronts Henderson**: During the winter of 2006, HENDERSON offered Officer A a ride home. During the drive, Officer A told HENDERSON that IA1 was an illegal alien, that it was unlawful to employ her, and that Officer A had terminated IA1's employment. HENDERSON responded that she was not at home when IA1 cleaned, and that she communicated with IA1 by note or by telephone rather than in person. HENDERSON did not say whether or not she intended to continue to employ IA1. Officer A assumed that HENDERSON would terminate IA1.
- years later, in the winter of 2008, Officer A again received a ride home from HENDERSON. In the course of their conversation, HENDERSON said she was planning a Temporary Duty Assignment in Los Angeles and was putting her cleaning services on hold while she was away. HENDERSON told Officer A that IA1's friends had been cleaning her home because IA1 had recently taken time off to have a child. (As set forth below, both of IA1's friends were also illegal aliens.) HENDERSON said that after she returned from Los Angeles, IA1 would be once again available to clean her home. This conversation prompted Officer A to again report HENDERSON's employment of an illegal alien to a supervisor. The referral to the Joint Intake Center, noted above, followed.
- 11. **Illegal Alien 1 Admits Illegal Residency**: On or about May 27, 2008, I interviewed IA1. IA1 admitted that she was a Brazilian national and said she had entered the United States illegally through Mexico a number of years ago. IA1 said that she cleans homes for a living and provided a listing of her clients. One of those clients was

"Lorraine," referring to HENDERSON. IA1 stated that she had cleaned Lorraine's home for several years and that Lorraine would pay her \$75 in cash each time. IA1 stated that she used to clean another person's home who works for the government, but she was fired by that person in 2005. IA1 said that she was fired by that person after IA1 admitted that she was an illegal alien. IA1 stated that Lorraine continued to use her cleaning services even though she learned that Lorraine works with "Homeland" and "Immigration" at the airport. IA1 provided HENDERSON's address, the access code to HENDERSON's residence, as well as HENDERSON's home and mobile telephone numbers.

- 12. Illegal Alien 1 Places Recorded Call to Henderson: IA1 agreed to cooperate in the investigation of HENDERSON. On or about May 27, 2008, IA1 placed calls to HENDERSON's mobile and home telephones. She left messages saying that she was back at work (after taking off several months to have a child) and inquiring if HENDERSON would again like her to clean HENDERSON's home.
- 13. **Henderson Seeks to Re-Employ Illegal Alien**: At the time of the May 2007 telephone calls, HENDERSON was on temporary assignment in Los Angeles. On July 7, 2008, IA1 informed me that she received a telephone call from HENDERSON. According to IA1, HENDERSON said that she was back from California and wanted for her to clean her home. Through a series of recorded messages and calls, IA1 agreed to begin cleaning HENDERSON's home again on or about July 22, 2008.
- 14. On July 22, 2008, and August 7, 2008, IA1 cleaned HENDERSON's home at HENDERSON's request. On each occasion HENDERSON paid IA1 by leaving \$75.00 in cash for her. On both occasions, HENDERSON left written messages for IA1 asking her to return to clean.
- 15. Henderson Arranges Additional Employment for Illegal Alien: On August 20, 2008, IA1 spoke with HENDERSON in a telephone call. The call was recorded. HENDERSON told IA1 that her neighbor, referred to herein as "Neighbor A," wanted IA1 to clean his home. HENDERSON had referred IA1 to Neighbor A. HENDERSON arranged for IA1 to work in Neighbor A's home.

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16. Henderson Warns Illegal Alien "to be careful 'cause 'they' will deport you": On September 9, 2008, IA1 met with HENDERSON in HENDERSON's home. At the direction of agents, IA1 made an audio recording of the conversation. At the time IA1 entered HENDERSON's home, HENDERSON's Department of Homeland Security vehicle was parked outside. That vehicle, a white Ford Explorer, was clearly marked with "Homeland Security" and "Customs and Border Protection" in large letters; it also had a Department of Homeland Security emblem on it. During the conversation, IA1 asked HENDERSON if that was her truck outside and whether she knew someone who could help her, "because I have a little problem, you know." HENDERSON immediately responded, "I thought you were going to try to get . . . married now." When IA1 said that she had had a baby, HENDERSON responded, "yeah so you have to put in paperwork and file but . . . you have to be careful 'cause they will deport you. Be careful." IA1 said that she had lived in the United States for seven years but could not get papers. IA1 told HENDERSON she was Brazilian and came into the United States without a visa. IA1 explained that she just stayed after coming in. HENDERSON warned, "Wow, wow, if you leave they won't let you back . . . you can't leave, don't leave . . . 'cause once you leave you will never be back." IA1 explained that she wanted to live in the United States for the rest of her life. HENDERSON responded, "yeah . . . yeah, let me find out and see what . . . you can do." During the course of IA1's cleaning, HENDERSON arranged for IA1 to return in two weeks to clean again. HENDERSON provided IA1 \$80.00 in cash for cleaning that day.

17. Henderson has Illegal Alien Return to Work after Warning: As requested by HENDERSON, IA1 returned to HENDERSON's home to clean it on September 23, 2008. That day HENDERSON left \$80.00 in cash for IA1 with a note requesting IA1 to return to clean again in two weeks. As instructed by agents, IA1 left a note for HENDERSON indicating that she would clean again on October 7, 2008. IA1 also thanked HENDERSON for arranging for IA1 to clean Neighbor A's home. IA1 also wrote, "did you speak with anyone about 'that thing' we spoke about." This reference was to their

As requested by HENDERSON, IA1 returned to clean her home on October 7, 2008. That day HENDERSON again left \$80.00 in cash for IA1 along with a note. In the note, HENDERSON asked a series of written questions including: did she enter the United States legally or illegally; where did she enter the United States; whether she had ever been convicted of a crime; and whether she had any legal alien relatives. HENDERSON also asked when IA1 would be back to clean. IA1 left the following responses for HENDERSON: that she was in the United States illegally; that she came across the border in California from Mexico and had paid a man to bring her across; that she had never been convicted; and she had no legal alien relatives in the United States. IA1 also wrote that she would return to clean on October 21.

Warning: As requested by HENDERSON, IA1 returned to clean HENDERSON's home on October 21, 2008. Again, HENDERSON left \$80.00 in cash for IA1 along with a note asking when IA1 would be back to clean, with some suggested dates. HENDERSON also wrote: "I will call you about the other question." IA1 responded by writing that she would return on November 4, and that, "I am a little worried about this problem I have, I will wait for your call."

20. On November 4, 2008, IA1 left a telephone message for HENDERSON. In the message, IA1 explained she had car trouble and was unable to clean HENDERSON's home. IA1 subsequently left a message for HENDERSON stating she was available to clean HENDERSON's home on November 12, 2008. I subsequently learned that HENDERSON had made inquiries with another Brazilian national who cleaned homes about cleaning HENDERSON's home. Without confirming a cleaning date with HENDERSON, IA1 went to HENDERSON's home on November 12, 2008 to clean her home. There was no money or note left for IA1 by HENDERSON. IA1 saw the business card of another Brazilian national on HENDERSON's kitchen counter. I then instructed

1	IAI to have no further contact with HENDERSON.			
2	21. On December 1, 2008, I interviewed two Brazilian nationals referred to			
3	herein as "Illegal Alien 2" ("IA2") and "Illegal Alien 3" ("IA3"). IA2 and IA3 are			
4	associates of IA1 and agreed to clean HENDERSON's home while IA1 took time off from			
5	cleaning to have a child. IA2 and IA3 admitted that they cleaned HENDERSON's home			
6	approximately five times starting in or about November 2007. On each occasion,			
7	HENDERSON left \$70.00 in cash to clean her home along with a note requesting that they			
8	return in approximately two week's time. Both IA2 and IA3 admitted that they were illegal			
9	aliens and were illegal aliens at the time that they were paid by HENDERSON to work in			
10	HENDERSON's home.			
11	22. Based on investigations to date, hiring a lawful cleaning service to clean			
12	a residence the size of HENDERSON's costs in excess of \$80.00.			
13	CONCLUSION			
14	23. Based on the information set out above, I believe probable cause exists			
15	to conclude that from on or about February 2006 to on or about November 4, 2008,			
16	LORRAINE HENDERSON did knowingly and willfully encourage and induce an alien to			
17	reside in the United States, knowing and in reckless disregard of the fact that such residence			
18	was and would continue to be in violation of law, and LORRAINE HENDERSON did so			
19	for the purpose of private financial gain, in violation of 8 U.S.C. §§1324(a)(1)(A)(iv) and			
20	1324(a)(1)(B).
